Nicky Collinson reports on the official opening of the ABDO NRC: a "visionary project" come to fruition



Beacon of progress for optics

▼ he ABDO National Resource Centre (NRC) occupies the top two floors of a bright and contemporary building just outside Birmingham city centre called Aqueous II. Incredibly, it took the Association just over 12 months to set up its state-of-the-art education and training facility - an achievement celebrated at its official opening by the Mayor of the West Midlands, Andy Street CBE, in September.

Praising ABDO for choosing to invest in the region, Andy told guests during the celebration: "We welcome the decision ABDO has made to invest in the West Midlands; to create jobs across region and make the most of all the facilities Birmingham has to offer. This is a day of celebration and looking forward with great confidence to a bright future for both the National Resource Centre and the expanding role of the optical profession."

In his preceding welcome address, ABDO president, Clive Marchant, spoke of the journey to 'build' the NRC and of its purpose. He said: "It's a little over a year since Sir Anthony Garrett, ABDO general secretary, and Pavan, our chief finance officer, began the search for a suitable property. Having found the Aqueous II building, the ABDO board approved this visionary and ambitious project last autumn and Alicia Thompson, director of professional examinations, and Phil Hall, head of the NRC, set to work designing the centre."

Clive went on to explain that an increase in student numbers and the challenges of using external facilities had necessitated ABDO establishing its own centre. He also spoke of the increased demand for dispensing opticians in the workplace, and the need to embrace new technology, and to adapt and expand practitioners' scope of practice.

"This centre of excellence provides ABDO, along with all of the optical profession and industry, with facilities not only to provide entry examinations and qualifications – but



the ability to upskill and advance," Clive said. "With his years of experience, Phil Hall is only too aware of how difficult it can be to find good quality facilities for training; a comfortable environment, excellent hospitality and high tech teaching aids and equipment. Phil and his team can provide us with the complete package."

Adding to Clive's comments, Alicia Thompson said: "Today's event has been an excellent chance for leaders in UK optics to join ABDO at this outstanding new facility. The NRC is the pinnacle of training and assessment. These facilities will ensure our members are both competent and confident to embrace change and explore the exciting potential this brings as we extend our scope

"AMAZING" TRAINING FACILITY

The clinical facilities at the NRC embrace the latest technologies in a wide range of equipment for dispensing, refraction, contact lenses, screening, minor eye conditions services and glazing. There are rooms for practical examinations, which can be opened up for conferences, seminars, training, revision and CET courses. There are also spaces for viva exams and smaller meetings, a fully functional glazing lab and 10 clinical bays equipped for refraction and contact lens training.

With the generous support of companies including Birmingham Optical, Essilor, Jai Kudo, Mainline Instruments, Millmead, Norville, Optix Software and

Specsavers, the NRC has all the tools it needs to firmly established itself at the forefront of optical training and education. Representatives from many of the supporting companies joined in the opening celebrations to learn more about its future potential.

Speaking to Dispensing Optics after the event, Trevor Rowley, managing director of Optix Software, said: "Nobody who visits the NRC could fail to be impressed. It will be of huge value to the profession and it's especially welcome to see such a resource being developed outside of London. We're delighted to sponsor the NRC by providing Optix software within the new clinics, and look forward to working with the ABDO team."

This was a view shared by Andy Hepworth, Essilor professional relations manager, who said: "The new ABDO NRC is an amazing optical training facility, which is in and around the best I've have seen across Europe. The objective structured clinical examinations in minor eye conditions services were held at the facility in August, and the NRC team is looking forward to hosting the next ABDO extended services training days later this month.
